Early horses of the forest

Equus, the modern horse, is the latest in an extraordinarily diverse and successful group of mammals that flourished throughout the Cenozoic and Europe over 55 million years ago at the dawn of the Eocene. The first horses bore little resemblance to those of today. These small forest-dwellers had relatively short limbs, walked on three or four padded toes, and browsed on leaves, seeds and fruit.
